Now due to a drastic increase in traffic, increase in distracted drivers, and lack of shoulder (especially on isabelle rd), I refuse to ride those roads especially during peak traffic hours.

I know that there is consideration of the trail system with partial closure due to wildlife, putting bike riders back onto Valmont for most of the year. Valmont, although having a wide shoulder, has some of the most distracted drivers I've seen around Boulder. To Whom it May Concern:

As a resident of Boulder County since 1993, living in Boulder, Gunbarrel, and Longmont, I have witnessed the inexorable transformation of Eastern Boulder County from predominantly rural to increasingly suburban. I've been riding bicycles in Boulder this whole time and I have been disappointed and frankly horrified as the lovely quiet roads of Eastern Boulder's farms and exurban neighborhoods have become overrun with increasingly heavy and distracted automotive traffic. I used to ride from Gunbarrel to Union Reservoir along Oxford Road to Weld 1 and felt relaxed and safe most of the way. Today to ride that route would be frankly suicidal.

During this same period, I have witnessed a resurgence in wildlife in both public and private spaces. The resilience of wild flora and fauna is greatly underappreciated in my opinion by those who constantly advocate to keep humans away from natural areas. Humans are just as much a part of nature as any muskrat, mink, or burrowing owl. To think that these creatures existed fully apart from humans prior to Boulder's unique brand of advocacy rising to prominence is arrogant naivete. Every stream in Boulder county has been walked by native humans for well over 10,000 years and the current mix of species has never known a time when humans were not constantly moving about the landscape. What we have witnessed in Boulder over the last 30 years is a simple situation wherein if we merely stop actively poisoning and trapping the creatures, they will return. The beavers setting up shop across the St. Vrain from Panda Express don't need to be protected from bicyclists and joggers. They need to be protected from cars and from PFAS runoff from industry. The burrowing owls near Vesper trail have survived generations growing up alongside runners with dogs. The mink I saw dart across 63rd street near Tom Watson Park wasn't afraid of a stroller, nor the picnic table.

The opportunity to transform an (effectively) abandoned railroad corridor into a safe route for people to walk, run and roll is rare and should not be abandoned!

Please, do not let yet another potentially wonderful route be locked away from the public. We have seen the natural experiment run across our entire county with populations of wild turkeys, moose, goldfinches and many other species living in relative harmony with people. We also have seen how regional trails contribute to mental and physical health as well as make it easier for young people to grow up wanting to support and maintain outdoor spaces. Those who worry that allowing people to use this corridor will damage nature or will bring in somehow undesirable people near insular property owner's are loud but misguided. History has shown that dispersed regional trails are beneficial to both citizens, nature, and property values.

Please build the BERT and continue to develop more trails in more areas. It is better to spread people out than to concentrate them all in a few areas. Every regional trail system creates reinforcing virtuous cycles of benefit allowing people to recreate and commute near their homes as well as making it possible to link and travel to other areas without needing to use personal vehicles.

Dear Planning Team,

With increasing human population and encroachment on wildlife habitats in Boulder County and surrounding areas, it is critical to protect the best remaining habitats. I believe this means further exploration of less environmentally harmful routes.

Preferred alignment 1b in the plan not only bisects a Habitat Conservation Area (HCA) at White Rocks on OSMP property, it passes through a number of valuable natural resource areas designated in the Boulder County Comprehensive Plan Environmental Resources Element depicted on maps on pp. 71 and 72 of the Plan, including Critical Wildlife Habitat, the White Rocks/Gunbarrel Hill Environmental Conservation Area, a High Biodiversity Area, and more.

The area of highest concern is along approximately 2.5 miles of alignment 1b where it passes through OSMP land, from about one-half mile west of the Sawhill Ponds parking lot, east to the White Rocks trail, which runs north/south on the north side of Valmont, about 0.6 miles west of 95th St.

Moving forward with an alignment where OSMP and CPW biologists have recommended seasonal closures for up to nine months for nesting raptors, herons, and ground nesting species *does not make sense*. Where were the OSMP and CPW biologists in this planning phase? I don't see any discussion of the use of dogs or nighttime use.

People *are* ranking wildlife and protection of the environment as important in surveys and in representations before the County (eg. public response to the EBC projects, etc.). Do we have accurate survey results of what people truly want for their public lands especially when they understand the scientific impacts? In this case I believe that the survey did not convey the extent of the damage that could occur to wildlife on Alignment 1b.

A recent example is the trail construction project on the Vesper Trail where Burrowing Owl nests were discovered and the work needed to be delayed until the season was over. I was impressed to hear a clip on NPR (KUNC's NOCO program) explaining the role of biologists and the need for the delay. I live and walk near that trail and talk to folks walking their dogs, etc. and people accept limitations when the reasons are fully

explained.

Please consider alternate alignments, at least from Sawhill Ponds to the White Rocks trail, in consultation with OSMP staff. One option, shown on the attached map as Modified Alignment 2, is a reconsideration of conceptual alignment 2, using the ROW along Valmont for approximately 1.5 - 2 miles. This portion of Valmont is rural and scenic, with relatively few driveways and would avoid most of the raptor nest buffer areas, the HCA, and ERE-designated resources.

In conclusion, yes, there is pressure for increased recreational access but not at the cost of losing irreplaceable wildlife, plants and ecosystems. How far can we cut up a pie before the pieces fall apart completely? I am involved in bird conservation and support the comments of the Boulder County Audubon Society submitted on this project, but these are some of my own personal reactions and conclusions. Thank you for your consideration.



I am writing to you in support of BERT, alignment 1B. For me this is both professional and personal in nature.

As the current Director of Devo Programs for Boulder Junior Cycling, and a former Instructor for BVSD's Safe Routes to School, I have worked with thousands of local children over the past two decades in the areas of cycling, road safety and advocacy.

BERT is one of the missing links in a regional trail system. As an East-West trail it links communities, and from a cycling perspective links existing key cycling destinations such as Teller Farms, Valmont Bike Park, Erie Single Track, The Erie Pump Track, and The Erie Velodrome. For many people, especially children and those without a vehicle, (often our poorest citizens), these destinations sit as islands, only accessible by car, or riding a bike on ever increasingly busy roads.

BERT would be made use of by many individuals and groups. Some keys ones that hit close to home for me:

- Boulder Junior Cycling Members, we are one of the largest cycling clubs in the country, having instructed and coached 1000's of youth to safely ride a bike the past 18 years
- Families with children to commute and to get to the aforementioned destinations
- High School Cycling Team Athletes. Most High Schools in the Boulder area have competitive cycling teams, statewide there are almost 3000 HS athletes racing in the Colorado High School Cycling League. This trail allows safe and easy access to training locations for many of the local high schools. This is where it gets personal for me. Several years ago my daughter was in a collision with a vehicle going 45 mph while on a ride with a local high school team, on the way to access a trail. She smashed the windshield of the car, totaled her bike and thankfully she walked away, physically unharmed. We should be looking at ways to safely allow youth self propelled access to trails. Unfortunately for too many cyclists and pedestrians this is not the case. Two pertinent examples: local High School student Magnus White was killed while riding a bike by a

vehicle last year and cyclist Andrew Bernstein was left for dead while riding from Erie to Boulder in 2019.

Increasing accessibility and safety for some of our most vulnerable citizens should be a goal, not a pipe dream.

I am very concerned that the current proposed route of this trail disrupts a large swath of critical wildlife habitats and rare cultural sites, in violation of both the spirit and letter of the Boulder County Comprehensive Plan.

I strongly support the creation of trails and bikeways for recreation and for cutting down on vehicular miles. But carving up critical wildlife habitats, rare plant communities, archaeological sites, and cultural sites is not the way to go about this. Once these areas are gone, they are irretrievably gone.

Worldwide, the current rate of extinction of species is estimated at 100 to 1,000 times higher than natural background extinction rates. Boulder County should not be contributing to that, especially when better options exist.

I support the letter sent to you by Steven Jones (also attached here).

I am writing to ask you to direct staff to take a second, more detailed look at options for rerouting this trail corridor door well south of the of the railway tracks between White Rocks Trail (800 m west of 95th St.) and 58th street.

I am writing in regard to the planned discussion on 10/24/24 of the Boulder-Erie Regional Trail.

I am opposed to the current preferred alignment (1B) specifically in the section from Sawhill Ponds to White Rocks. Here it crosses multiple areas of high environmental value, designated as important habitat for plants, animals and communities in the Boulder County Comprehensive Plan with site-specific or landscape-scale values. It punches through areas designated as Habitat Conservation Areas by the city of Boulder's OSMP, where people are not allowed. We must not keep damaging and fragmenting these important havens for biodiversity in the name of recreation, when we can reroute the trail to avoid them.

I am also dismayed to think that one governmental organization can override another's decisions, values and practices so easily. Multiple segments of the current alignment would be in conflict with CPW recommendations and OSMP practices for avoiding disturbance to nesting raptors as well as Northern leopard frogs. The Comp Plan calls for decisions to be made in a "coordinated and responsible" manner involving all relevant agencies, and states that "Preservation of our environmental and natural resources should be a high priority in making land use decisions." I support these statements and the coordinating spirit of the Comp Plan, and ask you to uphold a thorough, joint planning process that is both coordinated and responsible to the intended process laid out by the Plan and to the Environmental Resource Elements already in the Plan.

I ask you to direct staff to collaborate with city OSMP to identify a route near Valmont Rd, and north of it, to provide a safe route for pedestrians and cyclists while preserving the important ecological habitats near the railroad line - habitats that are already identified as valuable and already designated for protection by state, county, and city land managers.

As I am sure you will hear from many other residents, there are plenty of positives to creating more bike trails:

- 1. Safety. Having dedicated trails for bikers allows them to travel away from vehicle traffic and prevent tragic accidents.
- 2. Reduces pollution. Bikes (independently of cars) are safer, quieter and of course produce less emissions.
- 3. Promotes healthy, active lifestyle. Again, the fact that projects like these are prioritized in Boulder County are a draw for residents.
- 4. In line with Boulder Counties other safety initiatives. For example, the 119 bike path, extension to LOBO and possibly a new bike path along 36.

Of course, it's true that no projects can be undertaken without some other effects. In particular, having a bike path will introduce human traffic possibly in places where it does not currently exist. However, I would argue that:

- 1. The safety of cyclists is extremely important. In my opinion, Boulder County should prioritize non-personal-car modes of transportation.

Dear County Commissioners,

Globally, we stand in the midst of a wildlife crisis without a value system to preserve biodiversity. "Global wildlife populations have plunged by an average of 73% in 50

years..." Since 1970, in North America there has been a lesser reduction, 39%. But 39% is still a substantial number.

While it may seem that the actions we take in Boulder County make no difference, the truth is that running a trail through lands carefully cultivated by OSMP to serve the needs of nesting raptors, Preble's meadow jumping mice, and other critters tips the scale towards reduced populations that may lead to extirpation, which in turn may lead to eventual extinction. If human recreational desires are always given priority over the reproductive needs of raptors and other critters, it becomes a question of pace not outcome. Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) has recommended at least 9 months of seasonal closures along the Sawhill Ponds to White Rocks segment to protect the nesting raptors. The fact that CPW has recommended such extensive closures speaks volumes for the biological significance of the area and the need for protection.

Fireflies and Ute ladies'-tresses are among the invertebrates and plants currently found along the proposed segment of BERT that runs from Sawhill Ponds to White Rocks. CPW recently got authority to study and conserve these life forms. Passed in 2024, HB24-1117 authorizes CPW - for the first time - to study and conserve rare plants and insects. It is likely that the Sawhill Ponds to White Rocks segment contains invertebrates and plants that will gain future protection.

The golden and bald eagles living in the area are protected by The Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act (16 U.S.C. 668-668d). The Act prohibits taking of these birds, and the Fish and Wildlife Service makes it clear that "[t]he Act defines 'take' as 'pursue, shoot, shoot at, poison, wound, kill, capture, trap, collect, molest or disturb.' Regulations further define 'disturb' as 'to agitate or bother a bald or golden eagle to a degree that causes, or is likely to cause, based on the best scientific information available, 1) injury to an eagle, 2) a decrease in its productivity, by substantially interfering with normal breeding, feeding, or sheltering behavior, or 3) nest abandonment, by substantially interfering with

normal breeding, feeding, or sheltering behavior.' (50 CFR 22.6). The Fish and Wildlife Service goes on to say that "In addition to immediate impacts, this definition also covers effects that result from human-induced alterations initiated around a previously used nest site during a time when eagles are not present, if, upon the eagle's return, such alterations agitate or bother an eagle to a degree that interferes with or interrupts normal breeding, feeding, or sheltering habits, and causes injury, death or nest

abandonment."^[3]

While the best course of action would be to re-route the Sawhill to White Rocks segment of the trail, if you move forward then various mitigation measures should be considered including:

- Measures to preserve the hydrology;
- Keeping dogs off of the Sawhill Ponds to White Rocks segment as the presence of dogs even on leash is known to disturb wildlife;
- Wildlife crossing for amphibians, snakes, turtles, and other small critters.
- Study the impact of bike lights and runners lights on the existing trails and make appropriate adjustments to the hours the trail is open.

Finally, due to the environmental impacts of running the trail over to Boulder Creek in the event that the water table is too high to make an underpass feasible, please retain the Option for an Overpass at 287.

As you weigh the staff proposal, please bear in mind that we also live in a time when the reduction in wildlife populations from human generation to human generation resets norms. As the magic and beauty of our wild world is reduced, we too are impoverished.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment and for your service to the people, critters, and other life forms of Boulder County.

Dear Commissioners.

The current proposed alignment of the BERT (Boulder to Erie Regional Trail) between 75th and the Teller-White Rocks Trail would impact dozens of breeding birds and high-quality habitat. I urge you to direct your trail-planning staff to pursue, in collaboration with the City of Boulder Open Space and Mountain Parks staff, a route adjacent to Valmont Road, away from the bird nesting areas and their buffers. This would provide a safe year-round path for users and preserve the critical habitat on both sides of the railroad grade in this segment.

As you can see on the map shown in the <u>BERT Plan draft, September 6, 2024</u> pdf page 85/88, this "Phase 4" part of the trail has significant "resource considerations."

County and City maps show this area contains exceptionally high-quality habitat.

- the Boulder County Comp Plan designates this area "Critical Wildlife Habitat" and "High" or "Very High Biodiversity"
- the City of Boulder Open Space and Mountain Parks designates this area "Habitat Conservation Area" and does not allow human access.
- -in an era of biodiversity loss, we cannot keep fragmenting HCAs and adding to habitat loss by taking more for recreation.

State and Federal regulations protect the species that nest and forage in this area.

- -Bald Eagles are protected under the U.S. Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act and the State of Colorado has prescribed buffer zones around the nests to prevent human disturbance.
- U.S. Migratory Bird Treaty Act protects the Northern Harrier and the almost 20 other birds' nests along this route.
- Northern Leopard Frogs, a declining species of concern in our county and state, have a breeding population in this area.

Please consider alternate proposed plans put forward by citizens' groups like the Boulder County Audubon Society, in order to protect the precious nature preserves, Sawhill Ponds & the White Rocks Nature Preserve. The draft BERT plan, 1B is unacceptable as it stands & should be revised with a less ecologically harmful plan.

"At Sawhill Ponds, Critical Wildlife Habitat protects numerous rare bird species, plus remnant tallgrass prairie, which supports breeding monarch butterflies and a robust population of fireflies.

At White Rocks, Critical Wildlife Habitat protects rare plant species, breeding northern leopard frogs, and breeding habitat for numerous bird species that are rare in Boulder County.

Alignment 1B includes areas where OSMP and Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) biologists have recommended seasonal closures for up to nine months for nesting raptors and herons."

Also considerations have not yet been made in the draft plan for night time use of the rail lines since many of the resident wildlife species are active at night and would be detrimentally affected by the current plan.

Also in the draft plan there needs to be consideration whether to allow dogs on leashes on all or part of the BERT.

Hello,

My name is Jocelyn Phipps and I am a Community Engagement Coordinator with the non-profit Homes For Our Troops. Homes For Our Troops is a privately funded 501(c) (3) nonprofit organization that builds and donates specially adapted, custom homes nationwide for severely injured post 9/11 Veterans.

Veterans in our program choose where they want their forever home built and one of the Veterans in our program, Air Forse TSgt Adam Popp, has chosen to live in Lafayette, CO!

Adam Popp joined the military shortly after high school, following the legacy of many of his family members who also served. He joined the Air Force as an explosive ordnance disposal (EOD) technician and loved the sense of purpose he felt while serving and forming connections with his fellow comrades. He deployed to Laos and Diego Garcia before going on his first combat tour to Iraq in 2004.

During his second combat deployment, on Dec. 7, 2007, Tech Sergeant Popp was removing improvised explosive devices (IEDs) with the 455th EOD in Paktia Province, Afghanistan, when one of them detonated. The blast resulted in the loss of his right leg, damage to his right arm, traumatic brain injury (TBI), and hearing loss.

Now medically retired, Adam has been living in non-accessible housing ever since being injured. This forces Adam to constantly go up and down the stairs on his prosthetic, causing him constant pain. Living in this environment for more than a decade has taken a toll on Adam physically and emotionally. Though he has not used his wheelchair in years, he knows he will need it as he gets older.

That is where Homes For Our Troops comes in. We have built a specially adapted home for TSgt Popp! To celebrate the turning over of the keys, we will be hosting a Key Ceremony for Adam and his family on the morning of November 2, 2024. I am reaching out to your office because we would like to invite Boulder County's Commissioners to attend and speak at this event. We would ask that the speech be 2-3 minutes and focused on the Veteran. I have attached our speaking guidelines for further guidance.



Subject: Boulder County Commissioners' hearing on BERT (Boulder to Erie Regional Trail), October 24, 9 am

My Question: Why is Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) recommending multiple closures of the proposed BERT trail where there are existing year round trails?

- 1. Teller Farm Trails overview;
 - a. Trailhead on the south side of Valmont, about 0.5 miles west of 95thSt;
 - b. Trail south from Valmont to Arapahoe;
 - c. Trail north from Valmont to White Rocks trail;
- 2. Teller Farm North trail (TFN):
 - a. Distances from the trailhead to nests that involve CPW recommended closures:
 - i. Valmont to RTD ROW (Red Tailed hawk nest) 1,500 ft
 - ii. RTD ROW to Boulder Creek (eagle nest) 2,200 ft
 - iii. Note that the TFN trail continues northward from Boulder Creek to White Rocks trail about 4,250 ft.
 - b. My personal experiences:
 - i. I have lived in Erie for 13 years. Use this trail 4/5 times per year;
 - ii. Have never experienced closures, except after 2013 "1,000 year flood";
 - iii. During the last 4/6 years, I have frequently seen an eagle (or 2) perched in a tree adjacent to Boulder Creek. The tree is about 100 ft west of TFN;
 - iv. Have never seen or heard a Red Tailed hawk.
 - c. Observations on an early afternoon 75 minute walk on Sunday 10/6 (Broncos on TV at 2 pm):
 - i. 10/12 walkers, including family with 2 active noisy boys 6-9 years old.
 - ii. 8/10 bikers, including group of 3;
 - iii. 2 joggers;
 - iv. 1 horseback rider; also "evidence" on trail of previous use during prior week
 - v. No dogs (not permitted)
 - d. Eagle (nest #3):
 - i. Study distances to nest:
 - 1. existing year round trail 955';
 - 2. RTD ROW 1,640';
 - ii. <u>CPW Recommendation (from study document):</u> "No surface occupancy within 1/4 mile buffer around bald eagle nests. Seasonal closures during nesting season (December to August) within 1/2 mile buffer around nests."
 - iii. On my 10/6 walk, I saw 2 eagles perching at their favorite location, a dead cottonwood branch, about **100'** west of TFN. I saw them both walking northbound, and returning southbound about 30 minutes apart;
 - e. Red Tailed hawk (nest #7)
 - i. Study distances to nest:
 - existing year round trail <100';
 - 2. RTD ROW also <100';
 - ii. <u>CPW Recommendation (from study document):</u> "While this nest is in a "highly developed area," seasonal closure is recommended during nesting season (mid-

February to mid-July) given the extreme proximity of the trail alignment to the nest and the documented cases of red-tailed hawks attacking people in defence of their nests".

iii. I have never seen or heard a hawk in the past 10+ years. Unable to locate nest;

3. Sawhill Ponds:

- a. Overview:
 - i. Trailhead with a parking lot and picnic area is about 2,000' west of 75th St;
 - ii. Note; the Walden Ponds trailhead is about 2,500 north of the Sawhill trailhead. It is significantly larger than Sawhill's. The trails from Walden & Sawhill Pons intersect; many visitors use both trails.
- b. Red Tailed hawk (nest #4)
 - i. Study distances to nest:
 - 1. existing year round trail 80';
 - 2. RTD ROW 30';
- c. <u>CPW Recommendation (from study document)</u>: "While this nest is in a "highly developed area," seasonal closure is recommended during nesting season (mid-February to mid-July) given the extreme proximity of the trail alignment to the nest and the documented cases of red-tailed hawks attacking people in defence of their nests."
- d. Distance from the trailhead to the nest that causes CPW to recommend closure. Uncertain, perhaps 1,500':
- e. OSMP has advised that the Sawhill trails are NOT closed during nesting seasons;
- f. Observations from my early Sunday afternoon 1 hour walk on 10/13 (Broncos on TV 2 pm).
 - i. The parking lot had about 10 vehicles;
 - ii. No picnic tables (1 covered) in use
 - iii. Visitors were on multiple observation benches adjacent to ponds.
 - iv. 25 walkers (including some from Walden Ponds to the north)
 - v. No bikes (not permitted);
 - vi. no joggers;
 - vii. no horseback riders;
 - viii. 1 dog

Conclusions:

- 1. The CPW letter dated July 29, 2024 (and updated August 9, 2024 to Kelsey Blaho of OTAK does not explain why multiple BERT locations must be closed for nesting periods that are up to 8 months long, while there are existing year-round trails that are as close or closer to the nests;
- 2. Furthermore, the CPW recommendations do not consider any other criteria, such as the Boulder County Comprehensive Plan;
- 3. The study includes analysis and recommendations for mitigating ecological impacts on raptors;
- 4. Thus I strongly support adoption of the plan with Alignment 1b.

Thank you for the opportunity for Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) to comment on the Boulder to Erie Region Trail (BERT) nest recommendations analysis and report that has been produced by ERO for the BERT Corridor. CPW has previously provided preliminary comments on the trail alignment. We understand that this request is specifically to address the analysis and report produced by ERO on nest buffer guidelines that you provided to us on July 8, 2024. CPW understands that ERO determined in their analysis that the "soft-surface regional trail would not adversely affect the overall breeding success of the raptors and herons nesting in the analysis area or contribute to an overall decline in the species locally or regionally." CPW is responding to that statement with our recommendations below. We have included updates/clarification to the letter in red text as is here, otherwise, the letter has remained the same.

The mission of CPW is to perpetuate the wildlife resources of the state, to provide a quality state parks system, and to provide enjoyable and sustainable outdoor recreation opportunities that educate and inspire current and future generations to serve as active stewards of Colorado's natural resources. CPW has a statutory responsibility to manage all wildlife species in Colorado and to promote a variety of recreational opportunities throughout Colorado. One way we achieve this goal is by responding to referral comment requests, as is the case for this project.

Colorado Parks and Wildlife Area 2 and regional staff have reviewed the proposed site for the trail and are familiar with the area. Previously, CPW gave recommendations on trail



alignment, including variances on seasonal closures and distances from nests based on the alignments and location and circumstances surrounding the individual nest. The following are concerns and recommendations for the alignment that the BERT team has identified to us in a previous meeting as the preferred alignment that follows the existing Right of Way (ROW) concerning the nests in the trail alignment vicinity:

Recommendations

Bald Eagle Nests

An active Bald eagle nest site is a specific location in which a pair of bald eagles has at least attempted to nest within the last five years. Any nest location that can be directly tied to courtship, breeding, or brooding behavior is considered active. A buffer zone extends ½-mile around a known active nest. CPW has two recommendations to protect these sites: of a) no surface occupancy (NSO) within ¼-mile of any active bald eagle nest site, and b) no human encroachment or permitted/authorized human activities within ½-mile of any active bald eagle nest site from December 1 to July 31 of each year.

For the nests identified within the project area and the ¼-mile nest buffer, we provided the following comments previously: For the nest on the most western side of the trail (identified on the map provided at Bald Eagle Nest 1), we evaluated its location, and regardless of the alignment chosen, we would not recommend a seasonal closure in this particular nest because of the amount of existing disturbance around the nest. This pair of eagles started nesting while the gravel mine to the southeast was active, so they chose to nest even with the disturbance of the mine and the 61st Street daily traffic. Regardless of the trail alignment, we would not recommend a seasonal closure on the most eastern Bald Eagle nest (identified on the map given as Bald Eagle nest 4). This nest is close to HWY 287, 15 houses, and an access road the neighborhood uses daily, so this pair is also very tolerant of disturbance. This pair has an alternate nest that is very close to the active nest that was displayed on the map we showed during the initial meeting, and we are not concerned with this nest unless it becomes active. For all alignments, we recommend constructing the trail outside the nesting season (December 1- July 31). CPW's least preferred alignment would be the one that follows the existing right of way. This alignment is within the 1/4-mile buffer of 2 Bald Eagle nests (identified as Bald Eagle nests 2 and 3 on the map provided), and we recommend no surface occupancy within that ¼-mile buffer year-round. This year-round ¼ mile buffer would include a seasonal closure between December 1- July 31 on both of the nests identified, but first and foremost, we stand by our recommendation that there be no surface occupancy of any kind within 1/4 mile of the identified Bald Eagle nests 2 and 3.

Red-Tailed Hawk

This alignment is also within the $\frac{1}{3}$ -mile buffer for the Red-tailed hawk nests, which we recommend avoiding construction during the nesting season (Feb 15- July 15).

Specific to the nest identified as Red Tailed Hawk nests 4 and 7, while it is by our own definition in a "highly developed area", we would recommend a seasonal closure of the trail in both places, given 1) the extreme proximity of the trail alignment to the nest (over/next to the RTD track) and 2) the documented cases of red-tailed hawks attacking people in defense of their nests.

Osprey

CPW recommends no surface occupancy (beyond that which historically occurred in the area) within ¼ mile (1320 feet, 400 meters) radius of active nests. CPW recommends no permitted, authorized, or human encroachment activities within ¼ mile (1320 feet, 400 meters) radius of active nests from March 15 through August 15. Some osprey populations are habituated to and tolerant of human activity in the immediate vicinity of their nests. ERO's analysis and report state that the BERT alignment would adopt the existing OSMP closure buffers for osprey (OSMP's website states that OSMP has a closure every year from March 15 to Sept. 10 for Osprey nesting), and CPW agrees with this recommendation. CPW has reviewed this comment and stands by our previous statement that we agree with adopting the existing OSMP closure buffers.

Great Blue Heron

CPW recommends a 300-meter no-surface occupancy buffer zone during the nesting season, which is from mid-March to mid-August, but the trail alignment is outside of this buffer, so CPW has no further concerns.

The proposed alignment is outside the 985-foot (300m) buffer for Rookery 1, which we agreed with in our previous comments. However, ERO's report did not address Rookery 2, rendering our previous comment incomplete. The trail alignment is 580 feet from Rookery 2. Rookery 2 is also approximately 400 feet from 95th Street. However, roads are not a part of the CPW definition of a highly developed area, so we would maintain the 300m recommendation (which is a seasonal closure only from mid-March to mid-August).

Northern Leopard Frogs

Northern Leopard Frogs were identified in the project area, but they were not included in ERO's review. CPW recommends maintaining a 300-foot buffer around northern leopard frog breeding sites.

Dear Commissioners Levy, Loachamin, and Stolzmann,

I was deeply saddened to learn that Boulder County does, indeed, intend to run the BERT regional trail through the heart of the Boulder Creek floodplain valley. When this trail corridor was first proposed 40 years ago, quite a few of us didn't bother to comment, assuming that it was a pipe dream that would never be approved by Boulder County Parks and Open Space or Boulder Open Space and Mountain Parks. We believed then and believe now that running a regional commuter trail through or along the boundaries of designated Critical Wildlife Habitats, Rare Plant Communities, and Cultural and Historical sites would be in direct violation of stated goals and policies in the Boulder County Comprehensive Plan.

Foothills floodplains are among the most endangered ecosystems in Colorado; they also support very high levels of biodiversity along with multiple species of special concern, ranging from locally imperiled nesting northern harriers to locally rare buckeye butterflies.

Native mammals and charismatic raptors thrived historically in the Boulder Creek floodplain valley, including bison, which have yet to be reintroduced to Boulder County; river otters, now imperiled in Boulder County; white-tailed jackrabbits, recently extirpated from the plains of Boulder County; and long-eared owls, now locally rare.

Rare cultural and archaeological sites, all considered sacred by Native American peoples, are scattered across the floodplain valley. Recognizing this natural and cultural bounty, drafters of the Environmental Resources Element of the Boulder County Comprehensive Plan applied a number of designations to the valley. These include Critical Wildlife Habitats, Rare Plant Communities, Archaeological Sites, and Cultural Sites.

The Environmental Resources Element of the Comprehensive Plan acknowledges "our responsibility to ensure that native ecosystems and their native species populations continue to exist and flourish within Boulder County" (ERE-1.03). The designations within the plan, based on thorough studies of local wildlife and plant populations, set standards that must be followed if we are to live up to this commitment.

Several of the rare plant designations within the floodplain valley resulted from studies at the White Rocks State Natural Area, a dramatic outcrop of Fox Hills and Laramie Sandstone that supports several locally rare plants. Caves within the White Rocks support nesting barn owls (Boulder County rare) and may have once served to shelter human inhabitants of the valley.

At least half of the currently mapped regional trail route between 61st St. and 95th St. passes through or along the boundaries of County designated Critical Wildlife Habitat, City designated Habitat Conservation Areas, or both. The goal for protecting these sites in the Environmental Resources Element states:

Boulder County shall conserve and preserve Environmental Resources including its unique and distinctive natural features, biodiversity, and ecosystems through protection and restoration in recognition of the irreplaceable character of such resources and their importance to the quality of life in Boulder County (Boulder County Comprehensive Plan, *ER-4*).

Regarding Critical Wildlife Habitat, the plan states:

Areas designated as Critical Wildlife Habitat are considered rare, irreplaceable or difficult to replace, and are essential to the conservation and preservation of wildlife in Boulder County (ER-3).

Designated areas that the trail would pass through include:

 Critical Wildlife Habitat at Sawhill Ponds. This habitat protects nesting ospreys (Boulder County isolated and restricted), American bitterns (isolated and restricted), least bitterns (Boulder County rare), and green herons (Boulder County rare), along with a significant tallgrass prairie remnant that supports a robust firefly population and the highest concentration of breeding monarch butterflies I've observed within Boulder County.

- 2. Critical Wildlife Habitat within White Rocks Natural Area. This area protects cultural sites and rare plant communities, along with marshlands and riparian woodlands that support nesting American bitterns (Boulder County isolated), ospreys (isolated and restricted), bald eagles (isolated and restricted), and northern harriers (Boulder County imperiled); as well as the largest documented northern leopard frog breeding population within Boulder County (Will Keeley, Boulder Open Space and Mountain Parks, pers. comm.)
- 3. Archaeologically Sensitive Site. This designation applies to the White Rocks and surrounding habitats.
- 4. The White Rocks/Gunbarrel Environmental Conservation Area. This designation encompasses most of the lower Boulder Creek floodplain valley.

Finally, and vitally important, the lower Boulder Creek floodplain valley is a sacred home to the Arapaho and Cheyenne people, who still legally own all the land within the valley. Late nineteenth-century paintings by European-American artists show Arapaho villages in similar settings along the east slope of the Rocky Mountains. When we visited the valley with local Arapaho and Cheyenne tribal representatives, one told us simply, "Yes, this is where we lived."

Running a significant commuter trail through the heart of the valley would likely eliminate any future opportunity to restore significant portions of these lands to their rightful owners.

It would be extremely helpful if you could instruct staff to take a second, more detailed look at options for rerouting this trail corridor door well south of the of the railway tracks and critical designations between White Rocks Trail (800 m west of 95th St.) and 61st street.

Dear Commissioner Loachamin,

I would like to comment on the proposed BERT trail along the RTD Right of Way, Option 1b. This trail has been in the planning stages for many years and is highly anticipated by the cycling and commuter community. While I support providing a sustainable trail between Boulder and Erie to encourage bike commuting and greater recreational opportunities, I share the significant concerns that have been raised by CPW, OSMP staff, and the members of POSAC about the environmental impacts of this route in its current form. In an effort to minimize safety concerns and provide the most enjoyable scenic experience for the public, planners acknowledge that they chose to route the trail through the most sensitive wildlife habitat with the greatest potential conservation impacts.

CPW described 1b as their least preferred route due to its encroachment on 23 active raptor and great blue heron nesting sites. They instead supported the Valmont Road option, which planning staff indicated would present greater safety and logistical concerns. According to OSMP staff, following CPW's recommendations for seasonal raptor closures would require that the trail be closed for 9 months out of the year. OSMP has stated their historical commitment to following CPW's wildlife protection recommendations and failure to do so in this instance would compromise CPW's best practices for protection of raptor nesting sites and set a very bad precedent with potential adverse consequences. Necessary closures of this duration would clearly render the 1b plan unworkable.

OSMP staff have raised other concerns about the 1b route, which runs through large swaths of wetlands both north and south of the proposed trail corridor as well as remaining fragments of tallgrass prairie, an ecosystem that is rapidly disappearing in the face of increasing development. The 1b route would fragment and bring significant human disturbance through areas designated by

the Boulder County Comprehensive plan as Critical Wildlife Habitat, Preble's Meadow Jumping Mouse potential restoration area, Riparian Habitat Connector and Rare Plant Area sites, as well as the many raptor and heron nesting sites as it runs along the wetlands and protected areas of Sawhill Ponds and White Rocks Natural Area. The OSMP adjacent areas between 75th and 95th streets are described as having high value ecological resources and contain the largest concentration of habitat for the Northern Leopard Frog, a CPW Tier 1 Species of Greatest Conservation Need, and at least one Northern Harrier nest, another sensitive species of declining population in Boulder County.

POSAC members, in their September 26 meeting on the BERT plan, also asked many critical and difficult questions of the planners that were not satisfactorily answered, such as how, if at all, impacts to wildlife and habitat could be mitigated, how required closures could be handled without imposing a significant hardship on those who choose to use the route for commuting, whether an environmental impact analysis has been conducted in regard to potential residual toxins along the Right of Way remaining from prior railroad use (it has not been), how a potential decision by RTD to resurrect this section of track for a future rail line would affect the trail (it would likely require rerouting), and how potential problems arising from the high water table at the 287 crossing would be handled. The planners struggled to answer these and other excellent questions at the meeting and left the impression that there are many vexing issues associated with the chosen 1b route that have not been thoroughly thought through or planned for.

Both OSMP and BOCO Parks and Open Space have many excellent botanists and wildlife biologists on their staffs, yet I feel that their expertise and opinions have not been given sufficient weight in the planning of recent trail systems across Critical Wildlife Habitats and sensitive environmental sites. I am perplexed as to why the planners chose in the case of BERT to hire an outside firm, ERO, whose report had a "Don't Worry, Be Happy" feel, significantly downplaying the potential disturbance of introducing large numbers of people into the sensitive and protected habitats described above. In their responses, OSMP staff refuted many of ERO's conclusions and pointed out many flaws in their recommendations for routing BERT through the Right of Way.

Having to make an untenable choice between the safety of the riding public and environmental protection is unacceptable and suggests that we are not there yet in terms of finding the best route on which to move forward. I urge you to recommend that the planners work closely with OSMP staff to take whatever extra time is needed to find an alternative routing that does not jeopardize either our irreplaceable natural resources or safety. Until this can happen, I ask that you not recommend this plan in its current form. It is well worth some additional delay to make sure that we get this right, as the impacts will be long-lasting and significant, both to our environment and to the safety and enjoyment of the cycling community.







I had your email incorrectly when I sent this email to you vesterday so I am sending it again since it bounced back. Please be so kind and let me know when you have received my concerns.

Dear Commissioners Marta, Claire, and Ashley:

My name is Myra Mesko, I am a long-time Boulder County resident with serious concerns regarding the proposed BERT (the largest commuter trail in Boulder County) and the protected wetland & riparian zone BERT is is proposed to be built through. For decades we have been prohibited, and for good reason, to access the valley between 75th and 95th. This is the last refuge in Boulder County where the ecosystem is as it was centuries ago before humans encroached and destroyed the natural balance in this area. Man's desires are not always what is best for our Habitat Conservation Areas, therefore, I believe the decision made on Sept. 11. 2024 by the Trustees to support the largest commuter trail (Bert) through this fragile valley is misguided.

Option 1a & 1b would put the 10FT wide trail (much wider than the old rail bed which was decommissioned decades ago and has since been reabsorbed into nature) through the Habitat Conservation Area (native grasslands, wetlands, and riparian zones) in Boulder Valley between 75th and 95th which has a substantial conservation area of Rare Plants & Significant Natural Community areas outlined on the maps I am providing links to below. This conservation area is very important to plant diversity and habitat protection, it is prohibited to trespass without permission from Boulder County Open Space (OSMP), see picture attached. And how can anyone even consider the BERT commuter trail to be built on the RTD rail bed when they (RTD) have asked the trail not to be built there since they reserve the right to use their rail bed in the future. They have clearly stated that Boulder County would have to pay for the removal of BERT if they decide to reactivate the existing rails. The cost of BERT at \$19 - \$23 million would be a total waste if built only to be removed again at taxpayers expense.

The proposed BERT (open 24/7) commuter trail would introduce invasive plant species to the fragile wetlands which would devastate the rare plants and all that live & thrive in this eco system. It is estimated that hundreds of people will be hiking/running (with pets) & biking on BERT (including E-bikes) on a daily basis ~ day...and night introducing invasive plant seeds from shoe soles and bike treads that could devastate this Rare Plant Area & Significant Natural Community. Today it is off limits to human and canine traffic to preserve this ecosystem. Consistent human and dog traffic is not just dangerous to the fragile plant habitat, but also very disruptive to all the wildlife and rare firefly that currently lives & breeds in this protected area.

The stretch of Boulder Valley between 75th and 95th is home & breeding ground for bald & golden eagles, a variety of hawks including Harris, great horned owls, falcons, blue herons, herds of white tail deer, foxes, covotes, bobcats, turkeys, snapping turtles, salamanders, frogs, snakes, lizards, rare fireflies to name a few. Nocturnal migration in this valley is healthy and active with wildlife rarely seen by humans, but yet they indeed dwell there. I have real concerns on how OSMP is going to protect the Harris Hawk and Heron according to the Migratory Bird act which is a federal law. In addition the Eagle population mates, nests, and teach their young to hunt in this valley & grassland, surely you would not want to interfere and destroy this beautiful habitat. And by the time BERT would start construction we may even have more Eagle Nests in this valley that are closer to the RTD trac than they are today.

The wetlands and hayfields just west of 75th & south of the RTD rail bed are home to rare native plants which seeds are harvested annually by OSPM volunteers to be propagated in other OSMP properties throughout the county to ensure the survival of the species. Native plants needing protection in this area include, but are not limited to, big bluestem, little bluestem, switchgrass, prairie cordgrass, and yellow Indian grass. Additionally, the Bobolink, grassland sparrows, savanna sparrows, and grasshopper sparrows nest in the hayfield and tall grass, Harrier Hawks nest in the cat tails, and one can find turtles & fireflies in these wetlands which would be greatly disrupted if not forced to be displaced if this trail in implemented. White Tail Deer also thrive in this environment, we must protect pregnant and newborn which are extremely venerable during spring and early summer. There are plans to add fencing to keep people on BERT which would negatively impact migration of wildlife, especially the newborn, young population of our wildlife who would be separated from the herds/packs not able to overcome the fencing.

OSMP declares White Rocks is a refuge for rare and easily disturbed plants and animals. See attached. The rare Six-Lined Racerunner Lizard makes it's home in the soft, sandy soil of White Rocks Habitat Conservation Area. The hiking trail through White Rocks is only 3.5 - 4 feet wide and does not allow dogs, nor are they open 24/7. There are so many animals who would be negatively impacted if the proposed BERT is built in this protected valley. Special consideration must be given to all the aforementioned.

You can find all the aforementioned wildlife and sensitive native vegetation in this stretch of protected area for many reasons, one of them is that it is isolated from excessive human traffic. Only therefore, can this habitat exist and thrive in balance. This Natural Resource deserves to be protected as it has been for several decades, or as long as I can remember.

Option 1. From 75th run BERT south on 75th and use the scenic Valmont Rd. The speed limit could be reduced, which should be done anyway, and the commuter trail would be appropriately placed along a road and not through a delicate, protected valley. I have heard the argument that personal driveways would be impacted, but they already are negatively impacted with the current road, and it is my opinion that a slower speed limit would help these residents greatly. To ensure a slower speed limit you could install reverse speed bumps along this stretch on the road portion creating a safe alternative for BERT.

In addition, proponents of BERT claim that many would not drive cars anymore, rather use their bikes to commute to Boulder. If this is true, then Valmont Rd is the only option to explore since traffic would be greatly decreased with all commuting traffic moving to BERT. Please explore how Valmont Rd. could be transformed into an amazing commuter trail removing 18 wheelers from this stretch to make BERT a reality.

Option 2, From 75th run BERT North to the Lookout Open Space which already has multiple trails built on & through it, then build it all the way to 287 along Lookout Rd. The Views from Lookout are outstanding, and nature lovers will feel like they are on-top of the world with unforgettable views to the west of Longs & Indian Peaks, and entire Continental Divide. To the East the horizon is vast and seems to never end.....

These two options would provide beautiful scenery and will not impact our protected ecosystems we know are so very important to all of us choosing to live in Boulder City & County.

Please join me to be a voice for this delicate valley ecosystem, a beautiful natural resource, which will be negatively impacted forever with the proposed 24/7, 10 foot wide BERT Commuter Trail running through the protected conservation habitat.

Searching for Colorado's little-known fireflies

Owen Martin steps carefully through the knee-high grass growing up around a long-abandoned railroad track near Sawhill Ponds in Boulder, Colorado. It's almost pitch black out. The sun set 45 minutes ago, and the only light now comes from the distant buzz of cars on Valmont Road.

Or almost the only light. If you let your eyes adjust to the dark, you can just make out the twinkle from hundreds of faint specks. They flash on and off as if someone spilled yellow-green glitter across this empty field.

Martin, a doctoral student in computer science at CU Boulder, is hunting for fireflies.

"There's one right there," he says, holding up a butterfly net. "It's leading me on a little chase."

Many people who call Colorado home might be surprised to learn that fireflies (or lightning bugs, depending on who you ask) also live in the state. But, if you're lucky, you might stumble on a few pockets of these insects lighting up the night. You just need to know when and where to look.

That's what Martin and his advisor Orit Peleg are trying to figure out now. In a project that blends technology with natural history, researchers in Peleg's lab have spent summers since 2018 traveling across the state in search of fireflies. They use 360-degree cameras to learn more about the insects, including the patterns they make with their flashes. In many ways, the team is in a race against time. In Colorado, as in other places around the world, firefly populations may be vanishing as a result of humans paving over wetland habitats and saturating the night sky with artificial light.

"Firefly flashes are like a little, secret language," said Peleg, associate professor in the <u>BioFrontiers Institute</u> and <u>Department of Computer Science</u>. "They are very special, and we have a lot to learn from them."

Introducing Colorado fireflies

It's a new experience for Martin. The researcher grew up not far from this natural area in Louisville, Colorado, but had never seen a firefly at home until three years ago. He said that observing these animals in the wild is a "wonderous feeling."

"It's all dark, and you feel like the rest of the world isn't there anymore," he said. "You feel like you are floating in space, and there are all these stars moving around you."

At Sawhill Ponds, he's trapped one of those stars now. He gingerly moves the insect from his canvas net to a covered petri dish. The firefly is about a half-inch long, and you can just make out its orangish head and black wings. A light organ on the bug's abdomen glows, flashing like the beacon from a lighthouse.

Fireflies belong to a family of beetles known as Lampyridae, and roughly 2,000 species of fireflies can be found across the globe. It's not clear how many live in Colorado. The insects near Sawhill Ponds belong to a common genus called Photuris. The name roughly translates to "light terror" because female Photuris fireflies sometimes use flashes to lure in, then devour males from different species.

Entomology collections at the CU Museum of Natural History include specimens from Photuris and four other genera found in 19 Colorado counties—ranging from Yuma County in the northeast to Montezuma in the southwest. Martin himself has observed fireflies in the town of Divide, which sits near Pikes Peak at an altitude of more than 9,000 feet.

Still, there are good reasons why these luminous animals remain such a mystery in the state. Unlike fireflies in the eastern U.S., which can abound all summer long, Colorado fireflies

tend to cluster in swampy areas and are active for just a few weeks per year—appearing in the second half of June, then disappearing again by mid-July. Martin's research is supported through the President's Teaching Scholars Program and Timmerhaus Fund Ambassadors at the University of Colorado and by the City of Boulder Open Space and Mountain Parks. "A lot of people here come from places like the Midwest where they've seen fireflies. But they don't know about them in their own backyards," said Martin, who wants to raise "firefly literacy" in the Front Range.

Speaking firefly

Part of that goal hinges on understanding their secret language, Peleg said.

She explained that male fireflies flash to attract females, which often remain hidden on the ground. Each firefly species, however, has its own, unique flash pattern.

"It's like Morse code," she said. "It's this simple light on, light off signal, and that's probably as close as it gets to computer language, ones and zeros, in the animal kingdom."

To explore those patterns, her team uses 360-degree GoPro cameras to record fireflies in the wild. They then feed those recordings into computer programs that analyze the patterns. In recent research, for example, the group dug into the flashing behavior of fireflies in the Great Smoky Mountains of Tennessee—where thousands of insects synchronize their displays so that they all flash in unison, bathing entire hillsides in light.

Peleg's team found that these animals seem to achieve that feat by observing how their neighbors are flashing, then adjusting their behavior to match.

Martin is gathering similar insights into Colorado's fireflies. Eventually, he and Peleg want to build a library of firefly flash patterns—a sort of Google Translate for insects. That way, people could record video of fireflies flashing, then automatically identify what species they're looking at.

Protecting diversity

The researchers hope they can collect their data before it's too late.

How you can help fireflies

Coloradans can help protect fireflies by following these tips from the Butterfly Pavillion:

- Support land conservation and habitat restoration.
- Stay on designated paths when visiting natural areas to avoid damaging their habitat.
- Enjoy fireflies in the wild and don't catch them.
- Turn off unnecessary lights near their habitats in June through August.

Across the globe, research on fireflies remains scarce. But a growing number of hints suggests that some species may be disappearing.

In Colorado, artificial light is a major threat. Studies of fireflies from the eastern United States show that streetlights and other nighttime illumination can wash out the signals that fireflies are trying to communicate. It's a bit like trying to carry on a conversation in the middle of a crowded bar. (Such "light pollution" can also make it more difficult to see the

But there are a number of actions people can take to protect vulnerable firefly habitats. Martin and Peleg invite curious Coloradans to volunteer to help out with the research project. A team at the Butterfly Pavillion near Denver is also raising adult fireflies from larvae, which could one day be released into the wild.

The potential of those actions is on display at Sawhill Ponds. There, a strange light has caught Martin's attention. It's a firefly, but one with an oddly orange-colored light.

After a few swipes of his net, the scientist captures the mysterious insect. It's noticeably smaller than the Photuris bug he caught earlier. It's a Pyractomena, a completely different firefly genus and one Martin has not recorded at this spot before.

"This could be very exciting," he says.

The new insect is a reminder that scientists still have a lot to learn about fireflies in Colorado. Martin encourages everyone to get out and look.

"Turn your lights off," he said. "Then, between the middle of June and the middle of July, try to take some walks at night in your local wetland areas and see if you can find some."

I moved to Colorado after 10 years in Austin, Texas, and five years in New York. I grew up in the UK as a cyclist, both recreationally and as a commuter. In Austin, I was the ride leader for a bicycle shop ride that won awards and was regularly in Bicycle Magazine's top-5 shop rides in the USA

(https://jackandadams.blogspot.com/2011/08/shop-ride-sundays-schedule-update.html).

I'd heard about the promise of recreational Colorado, and for the first three years, I tried to make it work as a cyclist. It didn't work.

I've had more close calls in those three years while riding mostly on the back roads of Boulder County than at any other time in my life. In 2018, I was clipped by the mirror of an SUV while riding on 95th Street, south of 3rd Ave in Longmont. I was lucky; I was able to retain control of my bicycle and stay upright as it clipped the curb. The driver never stopped.

For the most part, now I only take my bike to the post office in Lafayette and Louisville, all mostly off-road. I ride into Boulder for "Bike to Work Day," but even that requires careful thought, planning, and estimation of traffic volumes.

I understand that an underpass at I-287 would be expensive, but in relation to cost, the amount of money spent on roads is relatively small.

I-287 is a "death trap," and there have been at least two fatal crashes on that stretch just this summer and endless other crashes. We used to cross at Oxford Road by cycling in the wrong direction, waiting for a big enough break in the traffic, crossing to the middle, continuing to cycle in the wrong direction until it was safe to cross the remaining two lanes. Stopping and trying to cross directly was simply too dangerous; even an Olympic cycling sprinter would have a difficult time crossing I-287 from a standing start.

I understand why politicians are unwilling to tackle spending by drivers in general; the cost of that is providing alternative safe routes.

Even though the trail would not come near Louisville, where I currently live, I would find a safe route to get to it and ride whenever I can.

I hope this letter finds you well. I am writing to express my strong opposition to the proposed trail development for the Boulder Erie Regional Trail. Specifically, the RTD disused railway track area from 75th to 95th. While I appreciate efforts to enhance outdoor recreation in our community, I believe this particular project poses significant risks to the local wildlife and the preservation of our open spaces.

The area in question is home to a diverse range of flora and fauna, some of which are sensitive to disturbances. We have the wetland conservation area to the west of the White Rocks Trails that has recently been redeveloped into wetlands at great taxpayer expense, but also the railway track to the east of the White Rocks Trail sees a great amount of wildlife activity. Bobcats use that area, along with a great deal of other wild animals. In fact I have a picture of a bobcat on the railway track that I can send you. The introduction of a trail would likely disrupt the natural habitats of these species, potentially leading to a decline in their populations. Furthermore, the increased human activity could lead to soil erosion, water pollution, and the degradation of the overall ecosystem. Not to mention the negative affect of wanderers to the neighboring farmlands.

Open spaces like this are invaluable not only for wildlife but also for the people in our community who cherish the natural beauty and tranquility they offer. My property at 9143 Valmont Road is under a conservation easement. I can't as much build a shed or park a trailer without having to consider the natural beauty of the area and seek permission from OSMP. Yet, now there are plans to run a multi-use trail right though the middle of this peaceful and undeveloped area. Once these areas are altered, they cannot be easily restored, and we risk losing a vital part of our natural heritage.

I urge you to reconsider this project and explore alternative options that would have less impact on the environment. Protecting our open spaces and the wildlife that inhabits them is crucial for maintaining the ecological balance and ensuring that future generations can enjoy the natural beauty of our county. Building a multi-use path here will drive out much of the diverse wildlife. Matt here with C4C. I hope to have someone speak in person at the BERT hearing. In the meantime, at the risk of repeating myself, C4C supports the BERT's construction using its proposed alignment, 1B. This position is shared with county staff. Staff has done a great job on this project.

C4C's fundamental objective is the full expression of the Boulder County Transportation Master Plan, especially its network multi-modal elements. The BERT is an incremental part of that plan whose whole is greater than the sum of its parts. As a whole, the TMP proposes meaningful or even transformative change in the transportation sector whose causal outcomes are significant across categories.

With the SH 7 / Arapahoe Project being at least 10 years from realization, the east-west non-motorized connection may be imperfect due to being soft surface, but it would be better than nothing for the time being. Especially for east county residents who may be geographically underrepresented until more multi-modal projects are completed.

Receptive to habitat concerns, C4C's position is that various agencies can work together to resolve those concerns. Cooperation can comprehensively weigh habitat and transportation topics at scale and make decisions accordingly.

Dear Commissioners,

I will not be able to attend the meeting on the 24th of October, regarding the Boulder to Erie Regional Trail. You will find comments below, advocated by the Audubon Society, which I am in full support. I ask you to consider the value in these proposals and act accordingly.

The BERT Plan DRAFT describes several conceptual alignments, and identifies alignment 1b as the preferred alignment, following the RTD rail right-of-way (formerly owned by Union Pacific Railroad). This alignment is very ecologically harmful, as demonstrated by tables, maps, and text in the Plan DRAFT. It goes through important wildlife habitats and ecosystems, including a Boulder Open Space and Mountain Parks Habitat Conservation Area at White Rocks and a number of valuable natural resources, designated in the Boulder County Comprehensive Plan, at both White Rocks and Sawhill Ponds.

With increasing human population and encroachment on wildlife habitats in Boulder County and surrounding areas, it is critical to protect the best remaining habitats. For the BERT, we believe this means *choosing a less ecologically harmful route* from Sawhill Ponds to the White Rocks trail.

While recognizing the community desires and need for safer routes for bikes and other forms of recreation, and staff time already dedicated to the BERT planning process, it is worth taking time to seek an alternate alignment that provides for safety and visitor experience, without sacrificing sensitive and rare wildlife and ecosystems. A short-term delay for County staff to collaborate with Boulder Open Space and Mountain Parks (OSMP) staff is a good investment of time to help prevent long-term, and perhaps permanent, loss of irreplaceable wildlife, plants and ecosystems.

The BERT planning phase has evolved from several conceptual alignments to one preferred alignment in the RTD rail right-of-way (ROW). Preferred alignment 1b is a finite width along and adjacent to the former railroad tracks, and leaves little room for avoiding or mitigating for invaluable wildlife and habitats during future project phases. The proposed preferred alignment will alter the hydrology of areas along and near the trail, affecting plants and animals requiring moisture.

One option is a reconsideration of about 2.5 miles of conceptual alignment 2, using the north side of Valmont. This portion of Valmont is rural and scenic, with relatively few driveways and would avoid most of the raptor nest buffer areas, the OSMP Lower Boulder Creek Habitat Conservation Area, and Boulder County Comprehensive Plandesignated resources.

As the evaluation table on draft Plan pp. 114-115 (pdf p. 58) clearly shows, preferred alignment 1b is highly detrimental to ecological resources., including the following:

This alignment bisects the Lower Boulder Creek Habitat Conservation Area at White Rocks on Boulder OSMP property

This alignment would pass through a number of valuable natural resource areas designated in the Boulder County Comprehensive Plan Environmental Resources Element (ERE, see maps on pp. 71 and 72 of the Appendices) including:

Critical Wildlife Habitats

White Rocks/Gunbarrel Hill Environmental Conservation Area

A High Biodiversity Area

Significant Natural Communities

Rare Plant Areas

Wetlands

Riparian Areas

The area of highest concern is along approximately 2.5 miles of alignment 1b where it passes through OSMP land, from about one-half mile west of 75th Street, adjacent to Sawhill Ponds Wildlife Preserve, then east to the White Rocks trail, which runs north/south on the north side of Valmont, about 0.6 miles west of 95th St.

At Sawhill Ponds, Critical Wildlife Habitat protects numerous rare bird species, plus remnant tallgrass prairie, which supports breeding monarch butterflies and a robust population of fireflies.

At White Rocks, Critical Wildlife Habitat protects rare plant species, breeding northern leopard frogs, and breeding habitat for numerous bird species that are rare in Boulder County.

Alignment 1b includes areas where OSMP and Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) biologists have recommended seasonal closures for up to nine months for nesting raptors and herons (see map on draft pan pp. 166-167, pdf p. 84 and CPW's July 19, 2024 letter, updated on August 9, 2024 on pp. 560-563 of the Appendices). Some of these nests will likely move somewhat over time, but 23 nest territories, shown on the map on pp. 164-165 (pdf p. 83) of the draft plan, are not going away before BERT construction starts. OSMP manages lands to conform to, or exceed, CPW's recommendations, and to maintain these standards would necessitate many months of closures annually. Proceeding with the preferred BERT alignment thus may generate conflict with OSMP's land management practices.

Additional advocacy topics to consider for your comments:

Preserving the option for an overpass at Highway 287: Plan pp. 52-53 shows two options for crossing Highway 287 - an underpass at the RTD ROW crossing and a jog north to Boulder Creek to cross under 287. Crossing under Hwy 287 at Boulder Creek would raise concerns about disrupting the creek corridor for wildlife. In case the water table is too high at the RTD ROW crossing and an underpass is not feasible, it makes sense to leave an option for an overpass at Highway 287 at the RTD ROW on the table.

Nighttime Use: Other regional trails in Boulder County allow use 24/7. If nighttime use is allowed on the BERT, especially through sensitive areas, many wildlife species are likely to be affected - from white-tailed deer, bobcats and owls to foxes and fireflies. Nighttime use is not discussed in the Plan DRAFT, but should be evaluated during this planning phase. Use data from existing regional trails such as Coal Creek and LOBO, including night use, may provide valuable context.

<u>Dogs:</u> Dogs are not discussed in the draft plan. A substantial body of research shows that the presence of dogs, even on leash, disturbs wildlife. Consideration of whether to allow dogs on all or part of the BERT, and leash requirements, should be included in the

draft plan.
