AGENDA ITEMS (ID # 6252)

The District Attorney's Office's previous and current Victims of Crimes Act (VOCA) award includes funding for two victim specialists (Positions 1 and 2 in the Project Budget) with an original approved budget of \$247,778. Following the March 22, 2021 Mass Critical Incident at the Table Mesa King Soopers, the Boulder District Attorney's Office has been working with Colorado's Division of Criminal Justice Office for Victims Programs to amend the prior grant agreement to include additional funding to support victim and witness activities following the mass homicide. This amended grant agreement increases the funding award to \$785,625 which includes for 4.0 new FTE positions (Positions 3-7 in the Project Budget; estimated at \$338,707). The other additional funding under this award is for supplies, operating, and one piece of equipment (a copier/scanner/printer).
